The City of Cambridge is starting its yearly planning for the next fiscal year - July 1, 2001 to July 1, 2002. In October the planning cycle will start with community members providing feedback through neighborhood meetings, written and phone surveys to identify service satisfaction, priority issues, and focus for the future. Informed by this community input, the City Council will then set its priorities in November to provide guidance for the City Manager as he develops goals and departmental budgets for the next fiscal year.

The City Council and City Manager are trying a variety of new approaches to get thoughtful and candid community feedback. For the first time the city is conducting a mail survey sent to every household in Cambridge, as well as a random sample phone survey, and this series of 6 neighborhood meetings. The purpose of the neighborhood meetings is to provide feedback for the planning process, but also provide an opportunity for residents to hear and speak with their neighbors about what is important for Cambridge. We will be asking the following questions tonight:

1. What do we want to maintain or protect in order to have a vital Cambridge?
2. Considering all the changes we are experiencing in technology, our economy, and lifestyles of our residents, what changes should the city consider to keep the city vital and the citizens engaged?
3. In planning for the future of the Cambridge, what issues are important to focus on?

WE ENCOURAGE MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO ADDRESS THE QUESTION WHEN IT IS POSED AND BE AS CONCISE AS POSSIBLE.

The sessions will provide an opportunity for attendees to speak, listen and explore with their neighbors what they care about in the city, what changes the city should entertain and what issues are important. The comments and priorities of the meetings will be recorded and compiled for the Council review prior to their planning session and available to you upon request.
