- WHEREAS: This City Council held a public hearing within recent months in order to discuss a proposal by Cambridge Electric Light Company (CELCO), to construct a new power station at the corner of Western Avenue and Putnam Avenue; and
- WHEREAS: At the conclusion of this hearing, the City Council as a matter of policy opposed the above proposal, since the Council determined that said proposal lacked sufficient alternatives to the site proposed, as well as insufficient community outreach work on this project; and
- WHEREAS: The City Council requested that CELCO withdraw said proposal and rethink the entire project, communicate with the neighborhood and submit to this Council any alternative proposal; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to confer with the appropriate City officials who have been monitoring the developments of this project, in an effort to determine what has been done to date, following the public hearing held by this City Council and further to report any changes or new developments to the Council as soon as possible.
