Proposals for Gravel for Stone Paving.

Sealed proposals will be received at this office until MONDAY, April 12th, at 12 o'clock, noon, for furnishing and delivering on Main street, between Pelham and Portland streets, about 1500 cubic yards more or less of best quality of gravel for stone paving, the same to be delivered as required by the Superintendent of Streets, and to be to his satisfaction.

Proposals to state the price per cubic yard delivered as above stated, and the gravel to be measured in the carts under the direction of the City Engineer where delivered.

Each proposal must be accompanied by a bond in the sum of \$200, conditioned upon the execution of the contract within five days from the date of the notification of the acceptance of such proposal, or in place of such bond the bidder may deposit at the office of the City Treasurer, a properly certified check for a like sum payable to the city of Cambridge, such check to be returned in case the proposal is not accepted.

A bond will also be required for the faithful performance of the contract in the sum of \$500, the same to be satisfactory to the Committee on Roads and Bridges.

The right is reserved to reject any or all proposals received.
