Dear Councilor Born:

On behalf of the non-contributory retirees of the City of Cambridge, we ask that the City of Cambridge City Council consider accepting the provisions of section 1281 of Chapter 411 of the Acts of 2000, an act relative to the election of retirement options for certain retirees.

This act would allow for a retirement benefit already provided to contributory retirees. In short, the acceptance of this legislation allows for an increase to the retirees allowance, at the time of death of their spouse. This concerns only those retirees that had originally chosen the option that would have continued to pay the spouse if the retiree had died.

As of this day acceptance of this act can only impact 19 existing non-contributory retirees. If you have any questions or require my attendance at the council meeting please contact me immediately.

THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

In the Year Two Thousand

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ELECTION OF RETIREMENT OPTIONS FOR CERTAIN RETIREES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Notwithstanding the provisions of section 135 of chapter 697 of the acts of 1987, the provisions of the first paragraph of section 58B of chapter 32 of the General Laws shall apply to benefits received pursuant to applications for such benefits, allowances or other payments made before January 12, 1988.

This act shall be prospective from the effective date of this act and shall not entitle a veteran to retroactive benefits.

This act shall take effect in a city, town, county, district or authority subject to the approval of the legislative body. For the purposes of this act, legislative body shall mean, in the case of a city, the city council in accordance with its charter, in the case of a town, the town meeting, in the case of a county, the county retirement board advisory council, in the case of a region, the governing body, in the case of a district, the district members, and, in the case of an authority, the governing body.

RE: Effective Date of the Noncontributory Pop-Up Act
DATE: March 8, 2001

After consulting with the Legislature, we have determined that the effective date of Chapter 411 of the Acts of 2000, the Noncontributory Pop-Up Act, is April 12, 2001. PERAC Memo #12/2001 indicated that the effective date was April 5, 2001.

Any calculations prepared under this Act which have been presented to noncontributory retirees need not be recalculated since the difference is de minimis. Any future calculations prepared should use the April 12, 2001 date.
