Since 9-14-76 I have been conducting periodic checks of the taxi industry to determine if the rate reduction for the elderly, as approved by the City Council in June of 1976, was in fact being implemented and adhered to by the entire taxi industry. The information gathered was a consensus of speaking with approximately 200 drivers and owners and finding that 95 percent were knowledgeable on this subject. The three major taxi companies and their drivers have been accepting the discount coupons since its origination and the owners stated that they will continue to notify their drivers as they report to work.

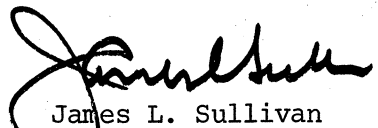
