To The Honorable, The City Council:

I am hereby requesting the appropriation of \$183,163.00 in the Grant Fund from The State Department of Education Bureau of Nutrition into the Human Services Salary & Wages Account \$5,000.00, Other Ordinary Maintenance Account \$176,663.00 and Travel & Training Account \$1,500.00. The Summer Food Program (SFSP) is a federally funded program which is administered by the State Department of Education through its Bureau of Nutrition. The SFSP was developed to serve as an extension of the School Lunch program which is offered to youth during the school year. The intention of the SFSP is to provide a continuous meal service during the summer months to low-income children participating in summer activities. Therefore, Cambridge programs providing summer activities to children 18 years of age and younger are eligible to participate if 50% or more of their enrollment is documented as low-income. In addition, several sites were designated as "area eligible" by state and will be allowed to serve all children in the neighborhood who drop in for meals.
