WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the public safety and convenience require that a new street, sixty feet in width, should be laid out from Bridge street to the southerly bank of the Canal south of said Bridge street, so as to form a continuation of Prison Point street,—and that a certain other new street, sixty feet in width, should be laid out from Main St. to the northerly bank of Broad Canal, so as to meet First street, if extended southerly to Broad Canal, all as shown on a plan in the office of the City Clerk. It is therefore hereby

ORDERED, That due notice be given to all persons interested, that this Board intends to lay out the streets before mentioned by taking a portion of their land and laying out the same as public streets, and that

is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.
