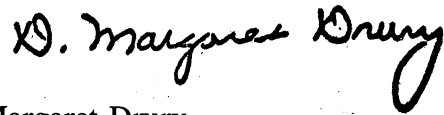

Athletes of the year: Abundance of talent makes for difficult choices

Dicking the top athletes of the year for the 1996-97 school year at Cambridge Rindge and Latin High is not an easy task. But the Chronicle decided to give it a shot.

Fall

Selecting volleyball senior co-captain Vanessa del Valle as the female athlete of the year for the fall is perhaps the easiest pick. Del Valle was a dominating player at the net for the Lady Falcons and led them to the state tournament. She was selected as an All-Scholastic for her outstanding play.

Lora Brill (cross country), Lauren Morse, Marina Mikahallis, Rosa Kline and Jessie Petrov (soccer), Danielle Hobeika and Courtney Shanahan-Scharveck (swimming), and Liz Rice (diving) all had outstanding seasons and were selected as autumn honorable mentions.

One of the most difficult decisions was the top male athlete in the fall. At least six candidates could stake their claim, but through a process of elimination it came down to two, junior Naod Mesfin of the soccer team and Luc Schuster of the golf team.

Mesfin led the Falcons with 22 goals, nine assists and to the Division 1 North semifinals. He was an All-Scholastic and Eastern Massachusetts All-Star.

Schuster edged him out to be the only junior selected as athlete of the year. He gets the nod because of his 8-1-1 record on the links, leading Cambridge to a Greater Boston League title and fourth place overall in the state. In addition, he was among the top 10 individual golfers in the state finals.

"I practiced every day at Fresh Pond and I enjoy the game," said Schuster.

Mesfin leads a cast of fall honor-

able mentions among the boys. Others were Peter MacEwan, Javi Mejia Blau and Tiago Moreira (soccer), Jason Bennett, Matt Power-Koch, Che Santos and Matt Birkett (football), Kevin Burns (golf), Lyan Gou and Ret Taylor (cross country).

Winter

Indoor track co-captain Lauren Morse is the pick as female athlete of the year for the winter. Morse was undefeated in the 50-yard dash and was responsible for the resurgence of the Falcons. She encouraged her friends from soccer to go out for track and will be playing soccer for Wesleyan College in the fall.

Cambridge finished the year at 4-4, finishing at .500 in dual meets for the first time in several years.

"I made a lot of friends playing soccer and I encouraged them to go out for track," said Morse. "I ran very well because [assistant coach] Curtis Jackman helped all the sprinters."

There were other outstanding female athletes last winter and several were chosen as honorable mentions: Tiffany Manning, Lateaya Linton, and Jessica Butler (basketball), Leah Dwyer, Sharae Sanchez and Julia Devanthery (track).

For top male athlete of the winter, it came down to basketball co-captain Ben Leff and indoor track co-captain Adrian Worrell. Leff did a fine job leading the Falcons to the Division 1 North Finals, but Worrell wins out because he led Cambridge to the league title and was undefeated while running in the 1,000-, 600- and 300-yard dashes.

Leff leads a group of honorable mentions which includes his teammates Carlington Bent and Lerrick Charles. Others were Jason Sutherland and Taylor (track), Yves Lamitie (wrestling), Kris Conceicao, Marco Esposito, Sean Hurley and Mike Lewis (hockey), Mike Sanchez and Tighe Troxel (swimming).

Spring

Girls tennis co-captain Danielle Hobeika is the female athlete of the spring for her near-perfect record at first doubles and for leadership as captain. Hobeika was always there to encourage and guide her teammates to a 14-0 regular season record.

Honorable mentions were Rhea Gibson, Heather Colman-McGill, Marley Marchael and del Valle (tennis), Morse, Josette Pierre-Louis, Dwyer, Sanchez, Nancia Pierre, Malory Cox and Maya Nichols (track), Kristen Scott and Emi Fujiwara (softball).

Volleyball co-captain Puchong Aramphong and baseball tri-captain Glen-Roy James are the male co-athletes of the year for the spring. Both Aramphong and James were outstanding performers and they both have an excellent chance of playing beyond college.

Aramphong was the Eastern Alliance Most Valuable Player and an All-Scholastic. He led the Falcons to the state finals and often took over a game when it mattered.

"It wasn't just me because we need five more people to make us a good team," he said.

James hit .400 (26-for-65), with 16 runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 15 runs batted in and five stolen bases while opposing hurlers pitched around him, not giving him many good pitches to hit. Professional baseball scouts were at some games, giving the quiet but successful center fielder a look.

Honorable mentions for the spring include Miscal Vilsant, Edson DeSouza, Neil Kadagathur and Christian Little (volleyball), Anthony Rambaud, John Fitch and Greg Maher (tennis), Jed Stiller, Danny Caceres, Power-Koch, Byron Lowe and Conceicao (baseball), and Worrell, Sutherland, David Collins, Leke Osinubi, Birkett, Winger Danier, Renny Waldron and David Hantman (track).

Manning, a 5-6 forward, continued to be a dominating force with 19 points, six assists and three steals. According to league commissioner Joe Walsh, Manning was the best player on the court.

Cambridge Police Department Detective Pat Nagle, a former Cambridge High and Latin standout, will captain one of two CPD basketball teams that will attend the games with almost 12,000 fellow police and fire athletes from 50 countries. A dozen CPD athletes depart today to take part in the festivities and chase a medal.

Nagle, 47, will play guard for the No. 1-seeded Cambridge Police Department Men's Masters 3-on-3 basketball team which won a bronze medal during the '95 Games in Australia.

"We're just thrilled to have the opportunity to go again," said Nagle, who will also compete in the bench press competition at the games. "We had a wonderful experience in Australia and now we're back to hopefully make some noise again."

The CPD team will try to make noise minus three starters: Superintendent Dave Degou and Deputy Superintendent Mike Giacoppo went down with recent injuries and Henry Korecki was sidelined by a heart attack. Korecki actually suffered the attack during a practice and was revived by fellow officers.

"One of our best players [Korecki] had to retire because of a heart attack and two others got injured," said Nagle, who has put the six-man team through a grueling training regime since returning from Australia in '95. "We held some invitation-only tryouts and [Melrose Police Sergeant] Dan O'Neill was unbelievable. I hadn't seen him since college but he was in exceptional shape, he could still leap and we instantly knew we had a special talent on our hands."

O'Neill is now part of CPD's regular rotation which includes 6-5 forward Tim Boyl (a 40-year-old detective and former St. Mary's of Cambridge star), 6-3 forward Gary Edward (a 41-year-old detective and former Rindge Tech star), Waltham PD's 6-10 Bill Stanton, and 6-2 swingman Sgt. Edward O'Callaghan (a 47-year-old former Cambridge Latin standout).
