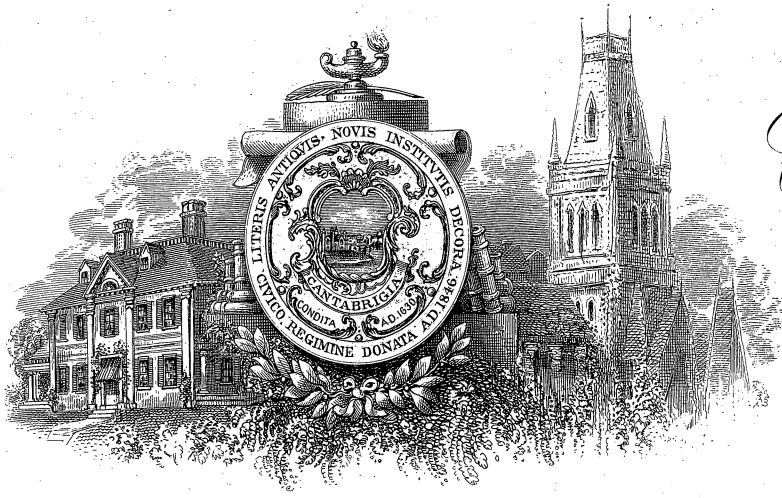

To the Honorable City Council.

The condition of the unfilled portion of the City wharf, near River Street bridge, is such that I recommend immediate action to be taken calculated to remove just cause for complaint from persons resident, or having business locations in that neighborhood.
