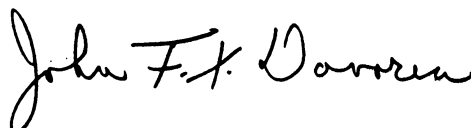

Purposes

The purposes of this Corporation are as follows:

As a corporation organized and to be operated exclusively for educational and benevolent purposes, to acquire by gift, devise or otherwise money and property of every kind, nature and description, and to administer and use the same and any income or proceeds thereof solely for such educational and benevolent purposes, to sponsor, develop, promote and encourage the education of pre-school age children and to engage in other projects in furtherance of the aforementioned educational and benevolent purposes. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any private shareholder, member or subscriber and no substantial part of its activities shall be carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation. The corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in, by publishing or distributing statements or otherwise, any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. In the event of the dissolution of the corporation, its then remaining assets, if any, shall not be distributed to its members but shall be distributed to one or more other organizations, whether or not (in each instance) incorporated, organized and operated exclusively for one or more purposes, each of which is denominated or defined in Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code as amended.
