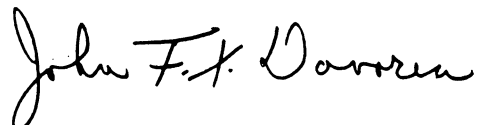

(2A)

A. To promote the welfare of Princeton University by working to improve the quality of life and education of Black and minority students at Princeton University; by assisting such students in their transition to such activities as they may pursue after leaving Princeton University. Through activities directed toward these ends, THE ASSOCIATION will make a concentrated effort to assist the Black students of Princeton University in the full realization of the benefits which may be derived from the presence of a Black population within the Princeton University Community.

B. To facilitate liaison between Black students enrolled in Princeton University, and the Administration of Princeton University and the entire Princeton University Community.

C. To facilitate liaison between Black students enrolled in Princeton University and the Black alumni of Princeton University.

D. To establish and maintain a capitalization program to provide funds for: the business operation of THE ASSOCIATION; for enrichment of Black educational experience at Princeton University through activities including, but not limited to course and curriculum development; endowments of professional chairs; and for increasing the availability

of a Princeton education to Blacks by dissemination of scholarships and loans.

E. To engage in any other activities that will reasonably result in the achievement of these objects, purposes and goals, which are not prohibited by law, the certificate of incorporation, or the By-laws of THE ASSOCIATION.

F. The objects, purposes and goals specified in the foregoing clauses shall be, except where otherwise expressed, in no way limited or restricted by reference to or inference from, the terms of any other clause in this Certificate of Incorporation, but the objects, purposes and goals specified in each of the foregoing clauses of this article shall be regarded as independent objects, purposes and goals. It is hereby expressly provided that the foregoing clauses shall be construed as conferring power upon THE ASSOCIATION to implement the above-stated objects, purposes and goals, but the enumeration of specific powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the powers of THE ASSOCIATION.
