- WHEREAS: The unemployment crisis has been felt over the past few years by all Americans of all age groups and races, and
- WHEREAS: The hardest hit group is the nation's youth, in particular Black and other minority youth groups, and
- WHEREAS: The national economy is showing steady signs of improvement with a commensurate decrease in the unemployment rate, and
- WHEREAS: This improvement is least felt by our nation's youth who will continue to suffer excessive unemployment, and
- WHEREAS: A number of local community based organizations in conjunction with other national organizations are working vigorously to achieve full employment for youth, now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That I, Alfred E. Vellucci, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby declare June 25, 1977 as Youth Employment Day in Cambridge and further urge all concerned individuals and organizations to work toward full employment for youth, and be it further
- RESOLVED: That this City Council be recorded in support of Representative Mel King's bill calling for 90,000 youth jobs in Massachusetts and Congressman Michael Harrington's full employment bill.
