June 26 & July 3	Election Commissioners and Registrars of Voters are required to hold meetings for certifying names on all nomination papers on the two Tuesdays preceding July 10.
July 3	5 P.M., last day and hour for filing nomination papers with Registrars of Voters and Election Commissioners for certification of signatures.
July 10	5 P.M., last day and hour for filing all nomination papers and all certificates of nomination with the Secretary of the Commonwealth.
July 10	5 P.M., last day and hour for filing certificates of enrolment of candidates at the State Primary.
July 25	Last day to register voters for the State Primary.
July 13	5 P.M., last day and hour for filing withdrawals of or objections to all nomination papers and certificates of nomination with the Secretary of the Commonwealth.
July 17	5 P.M., last day and hour for filling vacancies caused by withdrawals.
August 14	STATE PRIMARY.
August 27	5 P.M., last day and hour for filing written acceptance by candidates to be voted for whose names were not printed on the primary ballot.
August 20	5 P.M., last day and hour for filing withdrawals of or objections to nominations at the State Primary.
August 22	Last day to register voters for the State Election.
August 23	5 P.M., last day and hour for filling vacancies caused by withdrawals at the State Primary.
September 11	STATE ELECTION.

CAMPAIGN EXPENSES

August 15	Earliest day for filing with the Secretary of the Commonwealth of returns of receipts and expenditures for nomination.
September 13	5 P.M., last day and hour for filing such returns.
September 12	Earliest day for filing returns of receipts and expenditures for election.
October 11	5 P.M., last day and hour for filing such returns.
October 11	Last day to file certificate of no expenses, contributions or liabilities over \$50.00.

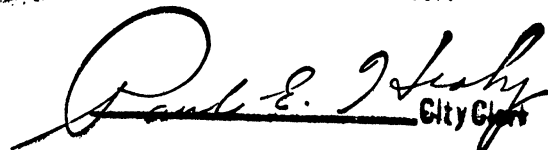
