June 24, 1985

- WHEREAS: Nancy (Stix) Lazarus, a woman known for her unflagging commitment to social justice, and her energy, activism, concern for others, and competence, died on June 11 after a long illness; and
- WHEREAS: Mrs. Lazarus was an advocate and organizer of a number of support services for people, such as the Legal Advocacy and Resource Center in Boston, that supplements disappearing federal legal assistance programs; WBZ's "Call for Action"; and the "Self Held Guide" for the New England Telephone Company; and
- WHEREAS: Nancy Stix Laxarus put energy into a number of Cambridge activities, as a member of the Cambridge Consumer Council, a mediator for the Cambridge Children's Hearing Project, and a board member of the Cambridge Adult Education Center and Visiting Nurses' Association; and
- WHEREAS: Mrs. Lazarus was active in many other activities that were political in nature and those that supported her strong concern for civil liberties, including the Civil Liberties Union of Massachusetts, the Massachusetts Advocacy Center, Massachusetts Council for Public Justice, Cambridge Civic Association, and Democratic party activities and candidates; and
- WHEREAS: She performed this myriad of services quietly, often behind the scenes, without seeking public recognition of her accomplishments; and
- WHEREAS: With all these commitments, she gave and received the love and affection of her family, her husband Maurice (Mogie) Lazarus, her daughters Jill Lazarus and Carol Lazarus, her grandson Sam Donovan, and her son-in-law Paul Donovan; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council hereby recognizes the extraordinary civic, political, and personal contribution that Nancy (Stix) Lazarus has brought to our community and to so many people; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk is hereby requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to be presented to the Lazarus family.
