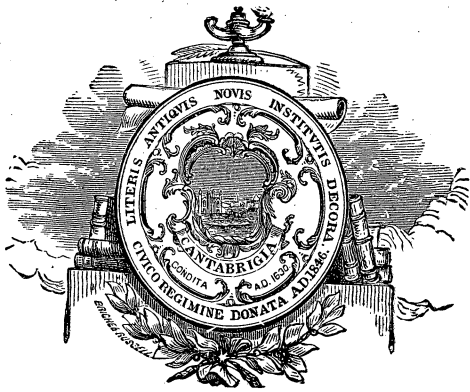




CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

The Committee on Roads and Bridges,
to which ~~were~~ referred ~~the~~ petitions for the acceptance of
certain private streets.

Reports,

Recommending

that upon the following, the petitioners have leave to
withdraw, viz:—

Frances M. Odious and others: petition for the acceptance of
Brighton street, so-called. This street is not in a proper
condition for acceptance.

C. B. Peagrand and others }
Samuel Merrill and others: } petition for the acceptance of
Belleme Avenue, so-called. There is available land enough
on this street, to make it forty feet wide, and it should be of
such width before acceptance by the city. The street should otherwise
be put in good condition.

Frank A. Smith and others: petition for the acceptance of
Appleton Street, from Concord Avenue to Vassal Lane.

In reference to this street, your Committee recommends the
adoption of the accompanying order instructing the Sewer
Department to put the street in as good condition as it
was, prior to the building of the sewer recently laid therein.
