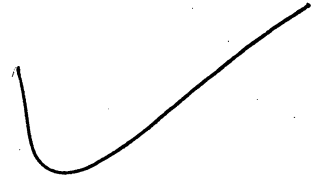

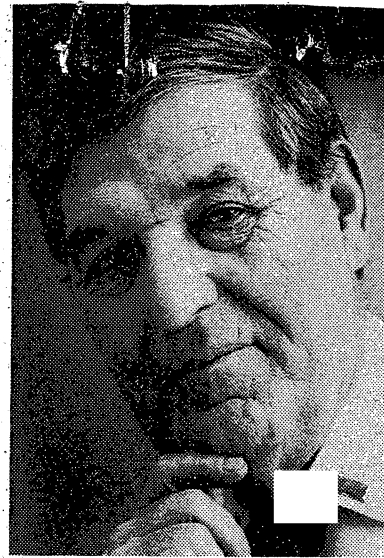

Louis J. DeMartino, 75

Executive officer of Dedham police

Louis J. DeMartino of Needham and Mashpee, former executive officer of the Dedham Police Department and investigator for the state attorney general, died Monday in Faulkner Hospital in Jamaica Plain. He was 75.

Mr. DeMartino was born in Dedham. He attended Northeastern University and served in the Marine Corps during World War II.

Before becoming an investigator for the attorney general, he was a member of the Dedham Police Department from 1948 until his retirement as lieutenant and executive officer in 1988.

Yesterday, his son-in-law, former lieutenant governor Thomas P. O'Neil III, described him as "a man with old world dignity and a new world mentality."

He leaves his wife, Eleanor (Crowley); a daughter, Jacqueline A. O'Neill of Boston; a son, J. Dennis of Somerville; two sisters, Victoria Abotti of Stoughton and Adelia Abotti of Dedham; two brothers, John of Medfield and Joseph of California; and two grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be said at 11 a.m. Friday in St. Cecilia's Church in Boston. Burial will be in Veterans Administration National Cemetery of Massachusetts in Bourne.
