WHEREAS: A petition was received from Deacon Transportation, Inc., doing business as Old Town Trolley Tours of Boston, 329 West Second Street, South Boston, Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS: The Sub Committee on Traffic and Transportation held a public hearing on May 1, 1991 and filed a report with the full City Council at its meeting of May 6, 1991; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That a license be granted to Deacon Transportation Inc., D/B/A Old Town Trolley Tours of Boston pursuant to Chapter 159A of the General Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for the operation of a tour bus service over certain public ways in the City of Cambridge as follows:

- *Pleasant Street between Memorial Drive and the entrance of Howard Johnson's.
- *Magazine Street between Memorial Drive and Granite Street.
- *Granite Street between Magazine Street and Brookline Street.
- *Brookline Street between Granite Street and Memorial Drive.
- *Amesbury Street between Memorial Drive and Vassar Street.
- *Vassar Street between Amesbury Street and the Western Connector.
- *Western Connector between Main Street and Broadway.
- *Broadway between Western Connector and Main Street.
- *Third Street between Broadway and Binney Street.
- *Binney Street between Third and First Street.
- *First Street between Third and Cambridgeside Place.
- *Cambridgeside Place between First and Edwin Land Boulevard.
- *Main Street between Broadway and the Longfellow Bridge; and be it further

ORDERED: That said license is granted subject to the following conditions:

1. Up to five movements in each direction will be performed daily and trolley type passenger vehicles will be used.
2. Stops for picking up or discharging passengers shall not be on public ways.
3. Service shall be restricted to passengers or patrons who have purchased tickets or passes for applicant's historical tours of Boston and Cambridge; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Council reserves the right to revoke the license granted in the event of the breach of any conditions outlined above.

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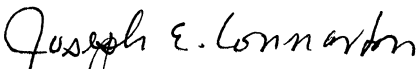

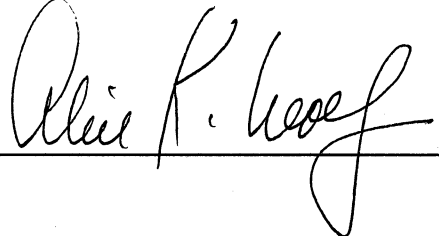

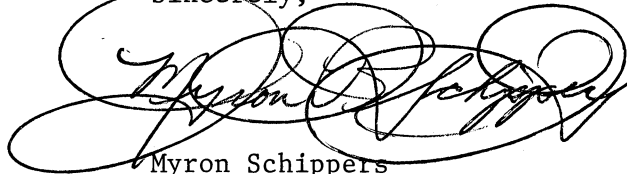

I am writing on behalf of the directors of the Harvard Square Business Association in support of the Old Town Trolley petition before your committee, to shuttle Boston passengers to meet their Cambridge trolley tour at Howard Johnson's several times a day.

The Business Association naturally would like to increase the number of visitors to Harvard Square during the warmer months of the year. This request is one small piece of an important and complex industry from which the State of Massachusetts and the City of Cambridge have much to gain. During these difficult economic times, every opportunity to take advantage of a business which brings visitors to our City should be maximized.

As you know the Chamber strongly supports efforts and activities which encourage visitors to come to Cambridge. According to the recent Harvard study the visitor industry:

- Enhances the diversity of the State's economy and protects against economic downturn,
- Encourages small business entrepreneurship,
- Provides jobs, especially for low skilled workers.

Studies have shown that 30 million visitors to Massachusetts spent 8 billion dollars in 1989, creating a total economic impact of 11 billion dollars on the State's economy and produced over a billion dollars in revenue.

In Cambridge, based on a study completed by the Chamber of Commerce, the visitor industry in 1989 generated a \$320 million dollar economic impact. Further over 3500 jobs are provided by Cambridge hotels alone and many more by related businesses such as, restaurants, bed and breakfast operations, and transportation services to mention only a few.

In 1989 the City received from hotels \$3,397,000 in property taxes and \$2,350,000 in room occupancy taxes for a total of \$5,747,000 in direct revenues.

For Cambridge, the visitor industry provides jobs and revenues which support our schools, human service needs, and arts and culture.

Old Town Trolley's Cambridge operation is an important element in this City's visitor industry. They are a quality company and have been generous in their support for Cambridge community needs. Their proposal for a shuttle will bring more people to Cambridge without the adverse impact of more traffic.

The Traffic and Transportation Committee conducted a public hearing on Wednesday, May 1, 1991 beginning at 5:40 p.m. in the Sullivan Chamber, City Hall.

Councillor Sheila T. Russell, Chair of the above referenced Committee convened the hearing and stated that the purpose of this evening's discussion was to consider the petition of Beacon Transportation, Inc., d/b/a Old Town Trolley Tours of Boston for a license for the carriage of passengers over certain public ways in the City of Cambridge. Present at the hearing were: Councillor Edward N. Cyr and Deputy City Clerk John E. Flynn.

Robert Parks, Esq., 20 Walnut Street, Suite 101, Wellesley Hills, outlined the specifics of the petition as revised to the Committee. The revisions were proposed after consultation and discussion with officials of the Traffic and Parking Department. (Copy of the revised petition is attached) Attorney Parks stated this petition, if approved, would be part and parcel of a circular route complementing City of Boston, Metropolitan District Commission and Massachusetts Turnpike Authority approved routes. The Shuttle would make between four and five runs per day highlighting Cambridge and Boston historical locations.

The Committee then heard from Mr. Lauren Preston, Deputy Director of Traffic and Parking for his recommendation on the petition. Mr. Preston stated that upon review of the petition, a favorable recommendation would be made if two amendments were made: a.) Amesbury Street from Memorial Drive up Vassar Street be added as a route and b.) The pick up or discharge of passengers not be made on the Public Way.

Councillor Cyr made the motion to incorporate Mr. Preston's findings into the final report to the City Council as conditions in the granting of the license. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Mr. Richard Scali, Acting Chair of the License Commission, stated two concerns that the Commission held in regards to the petition: 1.) Present petition adds competition to the hackney industry, and 2.) Payment of tour should be pre-arranged.

Attorney Parks in response stated that Mr. Myron S. Chippers, General Manager of Deacon Transportation would agree to the two conditions requested by the License Commission.

Councillor Cyr made the motion to incorporate Mr. Scali's recommendations into the final report to the City Council as conditions in the granting of the license. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Mr. Frank Anastasio, Chief Hackney Inspector, License Commission, stated that if the pre-paid ticket system is in place there would be no problems with the Hackney Industry.

At this time the Committee solicited public comment on the petition.

Mr. Arthur Santoro, a member of the Cambridge Taxi Advisory Committee, stated his sincere objection to the granting of the license citing the belief that the trolleys would be taking fares away from the taxi industry.

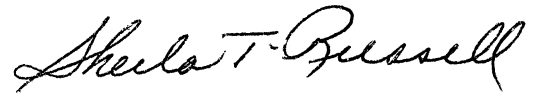

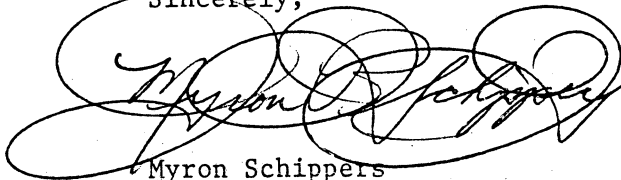
