

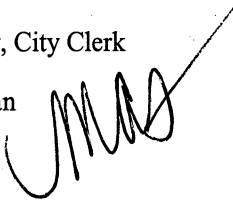

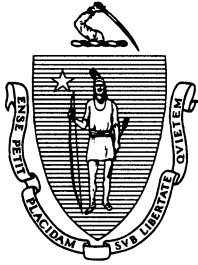

Thank you for forwarding the order unanimously adopted by the Cambridge City Council on June 16, 2003 in support of H. 1267, *An Act Relative to the Initiative and Referendum Petitions in Cities*, legislation that would limit the definition of registered voters to active voters only and require support from a majority of voters in that election to become effective.

As you may know, this bill was heard by the Joint Committee on Election Laws on June 12. As Chair of the Committee, I will keep your opinion in mind as we deliberate this issue.
