- WHEREAS: The news media has brought to the attention of this City Council that the Queen of England recently forbade her son, the Prince of Wales, from attending a Mass to be celebrated in the Pope's private chapel, while the Prince and Princess Diana were touring Rome; and
- WHEREAS: It appears from the comments in the press to be indicated that Prince Charles' attendance at the Mass would be "inopportune" since in 1701 the "Act of Settlement" was enacted forbidding any potential King or Queen of England from "being reconciled to or hold communion with the See of the Church of Rome"; and
- WHEREAS: In 1985 this kind of "tunnel vision" is appalling to so many who open their arms in a spirit of giving and caring for the needs of others; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record condemning the remarks of the Queen of England and to urge her and her son, the Prince of Wales, to adopt a more open mind in the twentieth century.

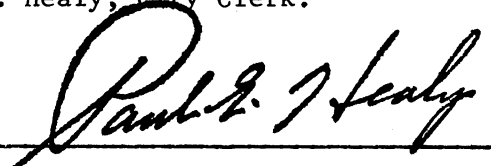
