Dear Mr. Corcoran:

I have completed my investigation into the reports that a driveway was built on the easterly side of Aberdeen Avenue, near Mt. Auburn St, and as far as I could ascertain there has always been a driveway at this location.

The location of an MBTA bus stop at this location was a result of a complaint from a Mrs. DeSouze of 2 Aberdeen Court who did not like the bus stopping in front of her house and driveway. Therefore, it was my opinion that due to the small number of stops made at this location, that it would serve the area best if the bus stop were moved to its present location, rather than in front of a home where parking would have to be restricted,

It is not the policy of the Traffic Department to locate bus stops in driveways, but where in our opinion, and the MBTA's agreement and under certain conditions, we will authorize them.

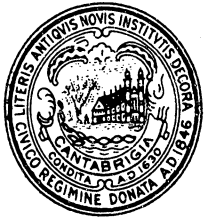


