- WHEREAS: On November 13, 1987, James Hairston of Cambridge, underwent a successful kidney transplant at the Beth Israel Hospital; and
- WHEREAS: James Hairston has been recuperating from this major surgery and has used up all his sick leave benefits; and
- WHEREAS: Mr. Hairston's co-workers attempted to donate some of their sick time in order for him to receive a weekly pay check to support his family; and
- WHEREAS: MIT has refused to allow this process to go into effect as stated by university spokesman Robert DiIorio; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its best wishes for a speedy recovery to James Hairston, congratulating his co-workers for their kind show of support and strongly urging MIT to reconsider their decision on this matter; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward suitable engrossed copies of this resolution to Mr. Hairston, Austin Petzke, an MIT physical plant supervisor and the MIT Personnel Director.
