IN CITY COUNCIL

MAYOR WALTER J. SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: Many Cambridge citizens served their country with honor during World War II, many of whom, unfortunately paid the supreme sacrifice, giving their lives during battle; and
- WHEREAS: Currently in the Cambridge Cemetery there are monuments honoring those deceased veterans of all other wars, but yet no suitable memorial has been provided for the veterans of World War II; and
- WHEREAS: The Cambridge Veterans Organization have urged the City Council to address this question of inadvertent inequality for those dedicated patriots who answered the call to duty; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to instruct the Director of Veterans Services and Benefits and the Commissioner of Public Works to confer with the President of the Cambridge Veterans Organization in an effort to devise a plan for the suitable construction of a permanent memorial to our World War II Cambridge veterans to be erected at the Cambridge Cemetery adjacent to the grave site of our departed World War II veterans.
