Leo Najarian, the former proprietor of the Fresh Pond Market in Cambridge, died Friday, Feb. 13, at Mt. Auburn Hospital, Cambridge. He was 88.

Najarian, a U.S. Army Air Corps veteran of World War II, was a native of Lynn and a longtime resident of Lexington.

He was the husband of Margaret (Semonian) Najarian; father of Mark Najarian, Crosby Najarian and James Najarian; and grandfather of Randi, Amanda, Jonathan and Amy Najarian.

Funeral services were held Feb. 16 at the Holy Trinity Armenian Church, Cambridge, with a private burial. Arrangements were made by the Aram Bedrosian Funeral Home, Watertown.
