Dear Mayor Russell, Vice Mayor Born, and city councilors:

We are writing to you to inform you of ongoing evictions which we are opposing. Every week at our meetings we discuss support for 20 or more cases. We appear in court each Thursday to help people.

Some of these cases are winning. The Vail Ct. Tenants Association, for instance, settled a 9 month dispute recently. The owner, Six S Realty, had sought to double rents. Tenants had not paid. The settlement includes an increase of about 25% and annual increases of 12% for 5 years. This long term agreement guaranteeing affordability and security should be a model for collective bargaining elsewhere.

In other cases, there are sometimes court outrages. One such was a decision by the judge that notice to Haitian rooming house tenants was sufficient if one notice was given to "John and Jane Doe". Other cases involve attempts to get around the state condo law.

In addition to these cases, we must express our continued support for an increased City financial commitment to affordable housing. We are aware that this fiscal year commits somewhat less than \$5 million to the Affordable Housing Trust Fund. But even that commitment is just for 1 year. We note that the City Manager recently announced that there was far more in the "free cash" fund than anyone had imagined. This greatly increased revenue should allow a larger and ongoing commitment to affordable housing. In some cases, members of tenants associations in disputes with landlords would like to seek subsidized purchase of a building by a non-profit. The Chiccarelli Tenants Association, which the Council has supported by a resolution, is one example.
