WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board the public safety and convenience require that the following public streets should be laid out as public ways, to wit:

COOLIDGE AVENUE, from Mount Auburn street southerly about 475 feet, to the former boundary line between Cambridge and Watertown, as shown upon a plan drawn by the City Engineer, and dated June, 1886; and

DAY STREET, from North avenue to the Somerville line, as shown upon a plan drawn by W. A. Mason & Son, and dated Oct 15, 1884.

It is hereby ordered, That due notice be given to the abutters on said Coolidge avenue and Day street, between the points above mentioned, and all other persons interested, that this Board intends to lay out the streets before mentioned, by taking a portion of their land and laying out the same as public streets, and that

is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.
