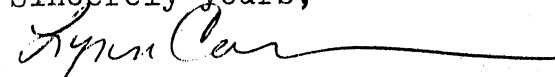
Dear Mr. Sommers:

We in Amnesty International USA Group 24 in Cambridge, hereby request permission to obstruct the public way in front of Holyoke Center, Harvard Square, on Sunday, April 17, 1988, from noon to 4 o'clock p.m. We will be asking passers-by to sign a 30-foot long petition to ask for the release of our Soviet Prisoner of Conscience, Hanna Mykhaylenko. We will not be collecting any money or doing anything but trying to get signatures for our petition. A camera crew from WNET (public TV in New York) will also be on hand to do some filming for a show they are producing on the Soviet Union.

We have already obtained permission from Harvard Real Estate to be on their property in Holyoke Center and hope that you will also grant us permission to be there on Cambridge City property.

In planning for our Holy Week Services here at St. Mary's Parish we would like to have the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday, April 1st, outside, weather permitting. For this event, we are requesting of the City the use of Sennott Park at the corner of Norfolk St. and Broadway between the hours of 12:45 p.m. and 2:15 p.m.

A procession would begin at St. Mary's Church at approximately 12:30 p.m., walking along the sidewalk of Norfolk St. to Sennott Park. In Sennott Park we would be walking as a group, stopping fourteen times for prayer and song. At the end, there would be a procession of return to St. Mary's Church.

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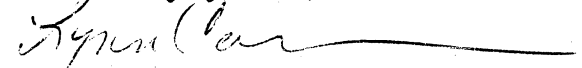
