In regard to the City Council Order of Feb. 8, 1954, to relocate Cambridge Electric Light Pole, now located in front of the premises at #22-24 Grozier Rd., please be advised that this pole is on the property line between No. 22 and 24.

The procedure is to notify the Cambridge Electric Light Co. in writing to relocate this pole. They will then take up a petition with the abutters and call for a public hearing before the Pole and Conduit Commission. The Commission will then decide whether or not the pole should be moved.

On my own observation, this pole services electric current to both of these houses, and as there is a driveway to #24, with the pole on one side, and a tree on the other side, it will mean that by relocating this pole one way or the other, the service wires will have to cross private property, and this the Electric Light Company likes to avoid.

Where this pole sets on the property line, and not wholly in front of any one person's property, there may be a charge for moving it.
