- WHEREAS:** The nations of the world celebrate each year the founding of the United Nations on October 24, and affirm their commitment to the principles and goals of the United Nations Charter; and
- WHEREAS:** This year, all Americans are asked to renew their support for and dedication towards the United Nations system and the important work it has accomplished for the past 45 years; and
- WHEREAS:** The United States and the 158 other member states of the United Nations must work together through the United Nations to relieve the suffering of millions, to protect our planet's environment, to promote human rights, and to bring about genuine and lasting peace in the world; and
- WHEREAS:** On the 45th anniversary of the founding of the United Nations, Americans of all ages and backgrounds join together throughout the nation on United Nations Day to demonstrate to the rest of the world that the United States continues to support the work of the United Nations through constructive and cooperative action on myriad world problems and concerns; and
- WHEREAS:** Through the Cambridge Commission of Nuclear Disarmament and Peace Education and other organizations, Cambridge supports United Nations efforts to attain world peace and meet the basic needs of people in all countries; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That this City Council proclaims October 24, 1990, as United Nations Day in Cambridge; and be it further
- RESOLVED:** That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare suitably engrossed copies of this resolution to be sent to the United Nations Association of Greater Boston and the Cambridge Commission of Nuclear Disarmament and Peace Education.
