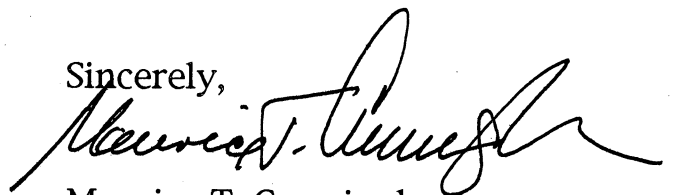
Dear Councillors:
