The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FOUR

AN ACT RELATING TO THE NUMBER OF LIQUOR LICENSES IN CAMBRIDGE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1.

Notwithstanding the provisions of General Laws, Chapter 138, sections 17 and 17A, or any other law, the Cambridge License Commission shall not grant additional liquor licenses pursuant to sections 12 and 15 of said Chapter in excess of the number of such licenses outstanding as of January 9, 1984; provided, that said Commission may grant up to four (4) additional hotel (all alcoholic beverages) licenses before January 9, 1994.

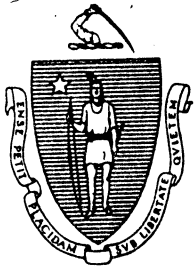
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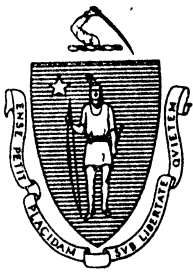

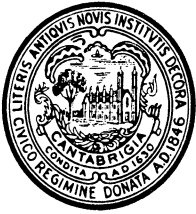
