To organize and provide educational assistance programs for children in elementary and secondary schools, to encourage volunteers to provide such assistance, to cooperate with members of the community in planning such assistance and to engage in all activities relative thereto which are permissible under Chapter 180 of the General Laws, as from time to time amended.

The corporation is not organized and shall not be conducted for profit, and the foregoing objects and purposes are subject to the following limitations: that no part of the net earnings or other funds of the corporation shall be divided among or inure to the benefit of any officer, trustee or member of the corporation; or any private individual, or be appropriated for any purposes other than the purposes herein set forth; that no payment shall be made to any officer, trustee or member of the corporation except as reimbursement for expenditures or reasonable compensation for services rendered; that no substantial part of the corporation's activities shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting, to influence legislation; that the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in, any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office; that the corporation's income for each taxable year shall be distributed at such time and in such manner as not to subject it to tax under Section 4942 of the Internal Revenue Code, as now in force or hereafter amended or

supplemented; and that the corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing (as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Internal Revenue Code, as now in force or hereafter amended or supplemented), retain any excess business holdings (as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Internal Revenue Code, as now in force or hereafter amended or supplemented), make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Internal Revenue Code, as now in force or hereafter amended or supplemented, or make any taxable expenditures (as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Internal Revenue Code, as now in force or hereafter amended or supplemented).

In the event of dissolution the remaining property and assets of the corporation, after satisfaction of its obligations, shall be conveyed to such non-profit corporation or corporations in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts organized and operated for charitable purposes and entitled to exemption from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code as amended, or any successor provisions thereto, or to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts or any political subdivision thereof for exclusively public purposes, as may then be designated by the members in accordance with the by-laws, or if no such designation is made or if such designation is not permitted by law as may be designated by a court having jurisdiction thereof.

exclusively for charitable purposes and in such manner as qualifies the corporation for exemption from Federal income taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code as amended, or any successor provisions thereto.
