- WHEREAS: February 7th through 13th has been designated as "National Child Passenger Safety Awareness Week" by the U.S. Department of Transportation, National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and promoted by the United States Conference of Mayors; and
- WHEREAS: It is vital to bring much needed public attention to the prevention of injuries and death from car crashes which are a leading cause of death for our nation's children; and
- WHEREAS: The National Safety Council projects that 3,500 additional lives could be saved by the use of safety belts and seats; and
- WHEREAS: Current nationwide studies estimate that only forty eight percent of children under the age of five are fully protected in cars in the United States; and
- WHEREAS: Deaths and injuries may be reduced significantly through greater public awareness, information, education and enforcement; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record supporting National Child Passenger Safety Awareness Week; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That City of Cambridge continues to promote safety belts, anti-drunk driving and general traffic safety at all times throughout the year.
