In Common Council, *Jan'y 28th 1890*
Ordered That the City Engineer be instructed
under the direction of the Committee on Roads
and Bridges to consult the Board of Harbor
Commissioners in reference to the widening
of the Draws on Charles and Millers
River Bridges; obtain their estimates of
expense; their requirements and recom-
mendations pertaining thereto, and
report the same to the City Council.
Also to report any other estimates
and recommendations, which in his
opinion may be more in accordance
with the requirements of the case, and
better provide for the interests of the city.
