Obituaries

James Scanlan Jr., FBI agent, member of racing panel; 74

James F. Scanlan Jr. of Braintree, a former FBI agent and member of the Massachusetts Racing Commission, died yesterday in Massachusetts General Hospital. He was 74.

Mr. Scanlan was a hard-nosed investigator who rooted out corruption at race tracks, investigated welfare fraud, and oversaw the Boston FBI bureau's organized crime squad.

In a story published in the Globe on Dec. 6, 1977, when he left the FBI to become a member of the racing commission, he was described as "the toughest and most demanding supervisor in the bureau's Boston headquarters."

At the FBI, Mr. Scanlan directed investigations of alleged racing at Suffolk Downs and at Lockingham Park in Salem, N.H. His appointment to the racing commission gave the Dukakis administration control of the three-member racing board for the first time since the governor took office and was credited with bringing an era of professionalism to the board.

Born in Boston, Mr. Scanlan

graduated from Boston College and Boston College Law School.

He joined the FBI after serving in the Navy in the Pacific during World War II. At the FBI, he was stationed in Philadelphia, St. Louis, and New York, where he was resident agent at JFK Airport. He joined the Boston bureau in 1967 and was supervisor of its organized crime squad when he retired in 1977.

Mr. Scanlan was a member of the racing commission from 1977 until 1979. In 1979, he became the state's chief investigator of welfare fraud as director of the State Bureau of Special Investigations. He retired in 1984.

He leaves his wife, Ruth A. (Savage); a son, James F. III of Virginia; four daughters, Patricia Canniff of Hull, Paula Rizzo, and Jean M. Gomez, both of Bridgewater, and Marie Dooley of Weymouth; two sisters, Marie Sybertz of Weymouth and Ruth of Dorchester; two brothers, John of Holbrook and Thomas of Duxbury; 14 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be said at 9 a.m. Saturday in St. Brendan Church in Dorchester.

H. Brian Holland, was federal official

H. Brian Holland, a tax law specialist who was an assistant attorney general during the Eisenhower administration and a partner of the Boston law firm of Ropes & Gray, died of cancer Tuesday in the nursing center at Brookhaven, a retirement community in Lexington. He was 96.

Mr. Holland was assistant attorney general in charge of the Justice Department's tax division from 1953 to 1956.

He was born in London and immigrated to the United States with his parents when he was 11.

After graduating from Yale College in 1925 and Harvard Law School in 1928, he joined the Philadelphia law firm of Williams, Brittain & Sinclair in Philadelphia.

He became a naturalized citizen in 1929. A year later, he began his first stint in Washington, working in the US solicitor general's office during the Hoover administration. There he met Attorney General William D. Mitchell's niece, Gertrude Bancroft, and they married in 1931.

Mr. Holland switched to the Justice Department's claims division in 1933 after the election of President Franklin D. Roosevelt. He left in 1935 to join Ropes & Gray, where he retired as a partner in 1976.

The Hollands lived in Wellesley until shortly after Gertrude Holland's death in 1975. Mr. Holland married Helen Buxton of Peterborough, N.H., a year later. In 1989, they moved to Brookhaven, where Helen died in 1997.

A lover of the performing arts, Mr. Holland helped build stage sets for the Wellesley Players Club and served on the board of directors of the Harvard Club.
