

In Board of Aldermen

Feb 27th 1867

The committee to whom was referred the communication of Levi L. Cushing and others, asking that the streets in ward five may be kept open, and safe for travel, and also suggesting, that in case of a heavy fall of snow, the alderman of each ward, be authorized to employ in their respective wards the necessary aid, to put the streets in a safe condition, without delay, would ask leave to report. That, inasmuch, as the streets are now in a safe and good condition, and whereas, an ordinance of the city, fully provides for the care and repair of the streets, placing them in charge of the superintendent, under the supervision of the Mayor and alderman, who are the surveyors of high ways and where duty it is to insist in keeping the streets in their respective wards

in safe condition for public travel, the
petitioners have leave to withdraw.
