COUNCILLOR WALTER SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Robert Duncan, former President of the Harvard Trust Bank and long-term resident of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Bob was a Phi Beta Kappa graduate from Johns Hopkins University and received his law degree from the Harvard Law School in 1922, practicing with the firm of Goodwin, Proctor and Hoar from 1922 to 1941, at which time he became President of the Harvard Trust Company, a position he held until he retired in the early 1960's; and
- WHEREAS: Once World War I broke out, Mr. Duncan enlisted in the Army and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant upon graduation from Artillery School in France and upon completion of the war, he was discharged with the rank of Major; and
- WHEREAS: Mr. Duncan distinguished himself in the banking industry through his keen fiscal and legal ability, serving as President of the Massachusetts Banker's Association as well as the Cambridge Chamber of Commerce and serving as a Trustee and Treasurer of the Mount Auburn Hospital, in addition to serving as a member of the Franconia, New Hampshire Planning Board; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Helen Duncan and the entire Duncan family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Duncan on behalf of the entire City Council.
