- WHEREAS: On May 15, 1989, the City Council received a status report from the Cambridgeport Rezoning Advisory Committee on its continuing efforts to write a zoning petition for the Cambridgeport area south of Pacific Street; and
- WHEREAS: Many Cambridgeport residents, including the Ward 5 Democratic Committee, have expressed dissatisfaction with some of the Advisory Committee's work to date, especially including its insufficient attention to exclusive light industrial zoning and to encouragement of affordable housing, and to the need for open space; and
- WHEREAS: The City Council, the City's policymaking body under the Charter, wishes to examine these concerns before the Advisory Committee completes its work; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Council hold a public hearing concerning Cambridgeport zoning on June 19, 1989, and that the City Clerk invite attendance by representatives of the Advisory Committee, the Community Development Department, the Ward 5 Democratic Committee, and other interested citizens.
