In reading the copy of the resolutions there is one date which I would like to call to your attention for correction as I know you will appreciate records of this nature become matters of history in the future.

The resolutions state that from 1881 to 1889 Father was a member of the Water Board. I think this should read to either 1899 or 1901 as it is my recollection that he was a member of the Water Board for about twenty years and served as its President for five years, during which time the acquisition of lands for and construction of the Stony Brook and Hobbs Brook Basins were completed.
