# The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETY-

## AN ACT

FURTHER REGULATING TRAFFIC ON A CERTAIN PORTION  
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DISTRICT COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to immediately authorize certain traffic on a certain portion of a way under the control of metropolitan district commission, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter ninety-two of the General Laws or any other general or special law or rule or regulation to the contrary, no person shall be prohibited from entering into and operating a truck, trailer or semi-trailer of any weight or size on Monday through Saturday, inclusive between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. on that portion of Memorial Drive in the city of Cambridge between a common way one hundred and sixty-five feet more or less south of Pleasant Street, and River Street.

Enactment hereof shall constitute approval of the use of Memorial Drive by the Metropolitan District Commission in accordance with the terms hereof.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
