- WHEREAS: This City experienced a devastating tragedy on June 12, 1984 when a fire broke out on Charles Street, causing the displacement of forty-six people from their homes and injuries to both residents and firefighters; and
- WHEREAS: Through the quick action of the Fire Department, under the direction of Chief Thomas V. Scott, who ordered that five alarms be struck upon arriving at the scene and assessing the severity of the situation; and
- WHEREAS: The additional firefighters and equipment which arrived at the scene provided the strength to contain and place under control a fire which already had ruined five buildings in the East Cambridge community, and had the potential of destroying an entire neighborhood; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deep sense of gratitude to the members of the Cambridge Fire Department and to those departments from surrounding communities who responded to the mutual aid call; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Chief Thomas V. Scott on behalf of the entire City Council in recognition of the outstanding performance of his department at this conflagration.

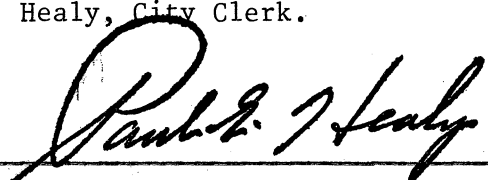
