On behalf of the Harvard Square Business Association, I would like to request your permission to hold our eighth annual MayFair in Harvard Square on Sunday, May 5, 1991 (with a raindate set two weeks later on Sunday, May 19th - skipping Mother's Day) from noon to 6 p.m. on JFK and Brattle streets.

Specifically, we are requesting permission, as follows:

1) To hold a non-alcoholic street fair on two blocks of JFK street (from the corner of Mt. Auburn street to Church street) and on part of Brattle street (up to Church street) on Sunday, May 5, 1991, with provision for a raindate Sunday, May 19, 1991;

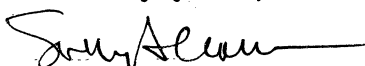
2) Overnight posting on May 4 (or May 18), in order to close part of JFK and Brattle street off to traffic with sawhorses on Sunday from 9:00 a.m. until 7:30 p.m. to hold our international spring fair and to allow time for set-up before and clean-up afterwards;

3) Placing kiddie rides in Harvard Square behind a temporary bandstand offering international entertainment at the intersection of Brattle and JFK street, in both cases leaving a 12-foot fire lane open for emergency vehicles.

The Harvard Square Business Association would again be responsible for providing supervision, public facilities, clean-up, and security for the Harvard Square MayFair.

We would be delighted if the City Councillors could plan to attend the Harvard Square MayFair starting at noon on Sunday, May 5 (or the rain date, Sunday, May 19.) Thank you all for your help and cooperation.
