WHEREAS:

The State of Massachusetts through the latest round of budgetary cuts has eliminated funding for the Supportive Services program which provides funding for many programs at the Cambridge Housing Authority, including the Work Force Program; and

WHEREAS:

The defunding of the Work Force at the same time that the program was receiving a \$100,000 award from the Ford Foundation as one of the top ten out of more than 1500 programs in the country reveals the completely arbitrary and misguided nature of current budgetary cuts; and

WHEREAS:

This shows that making cuts in the budget, just for the sake of making cuts without a well thought out plan will have a serious negative impact on many individuals and many fine programs; now therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That the Cambridge City Council urge the Governor of Massachusetts, to restore the budget cuts which have eliminated the Supportive Services program, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to send copies of this resolution to The Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Governor Dukakis, and the state legislative delegation.
