I have completed a study to determine the possibility of connecting Bolton Street through to Richdale Avenue. As you know Bolton Street is only 457 feet long and used to end at the incinerator. During the years that the incinerator was in operation, drivers used to cut through the incinerator. Over a period of time, people got used to using this as a shortcut.

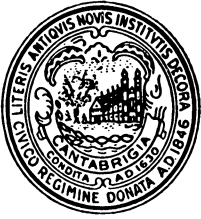
Bolton Street was never a through street and to open this up to Raymond Street would require the purchase of property by the City to construct this road. It is also my opinion that this road should not be extended as it would act as a shortcut through a residential area for motor vehicles going from Sherman Street to Walden Street.

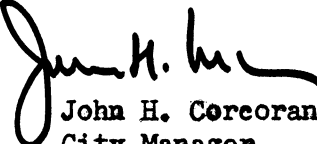
