After completing the job training program (which they are required to continue throughout their involvement) an individual is promoted to a Peer Leader. The Leader will be responsible for recruiting new participants, and increasing community awareness. They will be required to participate in either the resource center or the Youth Council. This will ensure constant flow of ideas and interests into the other two branches of the program. Peer leaders will also be responsible for maintaining contact with their recruits, and the director of the program. This will ensure a complete line of communication.

Needs will be voiced, once this is done a serious impact can be made on the way that Youth organizations serve youth.

Youth can become outreach resources. As peer leaders they will be able to sell programs that relate to their specific needs. This is a list of issues that have been raised in the past discussions with youth leaders..
