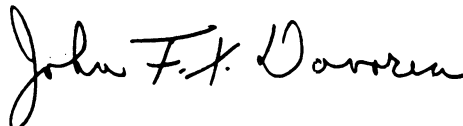

1. The name by which the corporation shall be known is:

VASCULAR LABORATORY, INC. ✓

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

Charitable, scientific and educational purposes within the meaning of the Internal Revenue Code, Section 501 (c) (3). Basic and clinical research, particularly in the areas of venous thromboembolism and disseminated intravascular blood coagulation. To conduct medical research in the public interest and to publish articles, theses and treatises in scientific journals and periodicals and to present and exchange scientific information at national and international scientific meetings and organizations.

To make chemical analyses, inspections, formulae, and to conduct medical research work; to maintain and conduct a laboratory for scientific research work. To establish and operate, for the benefit of the whole public generally, banks or storage reservoir of and distribution therefrom of blood,

blood plasma, human bone, skin and all types and kinds of human or animal tissue, together with the establishment and operation, for the benefit of the whole public generally, of any and every type or kind of scientific, technical or research facility designed to assist in the care, treatment, rehabilitation and cure of the human body by the medical profession; and to increase or improve scientific and technical knowledge for the benefit of humanity and the assistance of the medical profession.

To receive and maintain funds and apply the income and principal thereof to promote the well-being of mankind throughout the world; to use as means to that end, research, publication, the establishment and maintenance of charitable, benevolent, and medical research activities, agencies, and institutions, and the aid of any such activities, agencies, and institutions already established.

To make contributions to corporations, trusts, funds or foundations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, scientific or educational purposes.

To take, acquire, buy, hold, own, maintain, develop, work, remodel, sell, convey, lease, mortgage, exchange and improve and otherwise deal in and dispose of real estate, chattels real, and real property or any interest or rights therein without limit as to kind or amount, in furtherance of its corporate purposes.

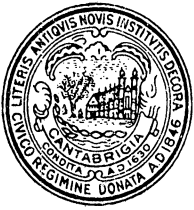
The corporation shall, without limitation, have the powers specifically conferred upon it by General Laws, Chapter 180, Section 6; and Chapter 156B, Section 9A.

To receive and hold in trust or otherwise, funds received by gift or bequest, which shall be devoted by it to the purposes hereunder.

To borrow money for its corporate purposes and to make, accept, endorse, guarantee, execute and issue notes, bills of exchange, and other obligations and to mortgage, pledge and hypothecate any stocks, bonds or other evidences of indebtedness or any other property held by it, and to lend money with or without collateral security.

To enter into, take and perform contracts of any name, nature and kind with any person, firm, association or corporation, which may be deemed valuable, expedient or convenient for this corporation in pursuance of or in furtherance of any of the objects of this corporation.

To sell, buy, adapt, repair, dispose of and otherwise deal in goods, merchandise, articles and things of every sort, kind and description, including the acquisition by purchase or otherwise, of all materials, supplies and other articles and things necessary or convenient for use in connection with the purposes hereof.

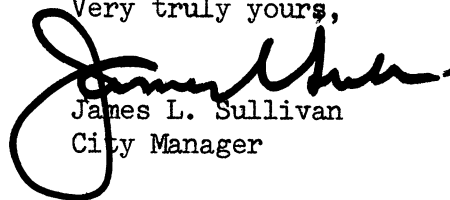
