- WHEREAS: John was the founder and president of the original Homestead Restaurant in 1950, where many young people met and formed long relationships, some of which ended in marriage; and
- WHEREAS: John always maintained an interest in the youth of Cambridge and regularly contributed to the Babe Ruth League in an effort to continue the League's existence as such an important recreational outlet; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the entire Lingos family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
