To the Honorable, the City Council:

We, Margaret M. Trelegan of 61 Clay Street, Cambridge and Vincent J. Trelegan of 35 Clay Street, Cambridge, doing business as F. W. Trelegan & Company, hereby make application for a license to carry on the business of slaughtering neat cattle (including calves), sheep or swine within the limits of the City of Cambridge for the year ending April 30, 1945.

In support of this application we state the following facts:-

The slaughter house or premises where the business is to be conducted is located at 51-53 Clay Street in the City of Cambridge and consists of concrete building.

The business to be carried on thereat and the products thereof to be sold or used for food are: **

Sides of beef, carcasses of veal, mutton, lamb and pork.

The estimated number of animals to be slaughtered thereat per week are 10 neat cattle; 200 calves; 100 sheep; 25 swine.

We intend to slaughter said animals at the said establishment on the following-named days and at the designated times of day in each week:- Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday (excepting holidays) between the hours of 7:00 A. M. and 6:00 P. M. and we further certify that the above designated days and times of days are selected in good faith, and that in our judgment it is necessary to slaughter on as many days and at the times above set forth in order to properly carry on the business to be conducted in said establishment.

NOTE -INSTRUCTIONS TO CITIES AND TOWNS. The license should be granted to slaughter only such animals as are designated in the application, the license being required for neat cattle, sheep or swine. Applications are to be made in duplicate, and, if granted, one copy is to be retained by the board granting the license, the applicant to receive the license. A copy of each application, and also the license thereon, if granted, otherwise a copy of the record of the action taken by the proper board upon such application, must be sent to the State Department of Public Health, Boston, before the first day of June in each year.
