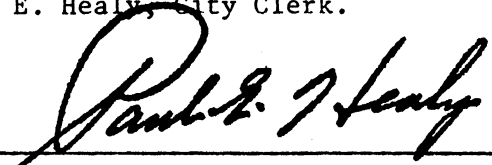
COUNCILLOR WALTER SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that due to the quick action of Mrs. Mary Ellen Campbell, a Nurses Aide at the Neville Manor, a life was saved; and
- WHEREAS: While on duty recently, Mrs. Campbell noticed Mrs. Margaret Hickey lying on the floor having difficulty breathing and having determined that Mrs. Hickey was choking on a piece of food, immediately applied the "Heimlich Maneuver" and was successful in removing the obstruction, thereby allowing Mrs. Hickey to breathe freely; and
- WHEREAS: This quick action prevented a potential tragedy involving a woman who has been a long time Cambridge resident and wife of Funeral Director William T. Hickey; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its sincere congratulations to Mrs. Mary Ellen Campbell in recognition of her "call to duty" and dedication to the residents of Neville Manor; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Campbell on behalf of the entire City Council.
