- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Joseph E. Maynard, a 20-year veteran of the Cambridge School Committee; and
- WHEREAS: Joe was born, raised and died at his Harvard Street home where his working class roots motivated him to be the defender of the rights of the disadvantaged; and
- WHEREAS: Joe attended St. Mary's Parochial School and upon graduation married the late Florence Levy of Cambridge, then served in the Navy during World War II after which Joe returned home and attended Wentworth Institute of Technology in Boston; and
- WHEREAS: Joe, a 38-year employee of the City's Public Works Department who most recently served as a working foreman in the forestry and park division, was a staunch supporter and activist in Local 195; and
- WHEREAS: Joe's tenure on the School Committee, to which he was first elected in 1955, was characterized by a heartfelt persistence to provide educational opportunities for all students, especially those with special learning needs, and bilingual and underprivileged students; and
- WHEREAS: Joe's sincerity and forthrightness will be sorely missed but his memory shall serve as an inspiration to all those who are committed to properly educating all of our schoolchildren; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of Joseph E. Maynard at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.

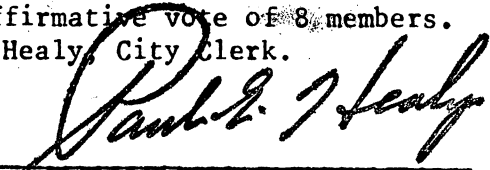
