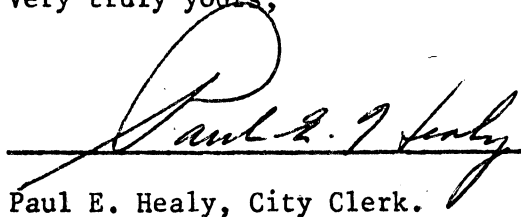

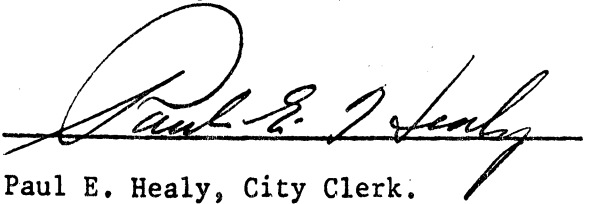
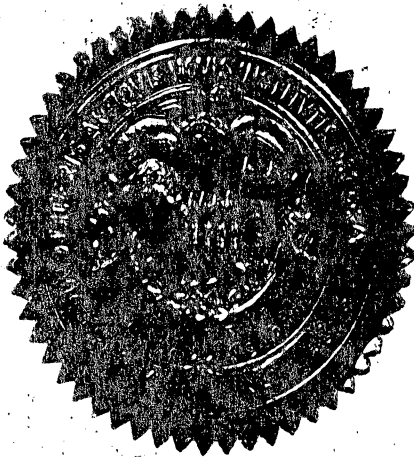

Light on porches makes it difficult for criminals to find places to hide. Better lighting makes us feel safe on the streets of our own community.

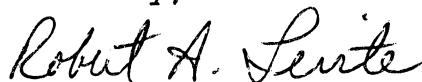
